The Fort Ord Rec Trail and Greenway implements the Trail / Open-Space Link and other trailways indicated in the Fort Ord Reuse Plan












FORTAG – Major trail connections within Marina




FORTAG – northern loop near CSUMB & Marina




FORTAG - Segments between State Park and Intergarrison Rd


















